General Information

Airport Transfers

The most convenient means of transport is by taxi. Flagdown fare is \$2.40 for the first 1km, with surcharge of \$\$3 for trips from Changi Airport. Other additional charges include 50% charge for trips between midnight and 6.00 am. The AIRBUS operates daily from 6.00 am to midnight at every 20 minutes with stops at major hotels.

Airport Tax

An airport departure tax of S\$21 applies to all destinations departing from Singapore.

Visas

All international visitors require a valid passport for entry into Singapore and some visitors will require a visa also. Please check with your travel agent or local Singapore Embassy for information. If you require a visa, we recommend that you apply early as processing documentation can take time.

Weather

Singapore enjoys warm tropical weather throughout the year. Temperatures reach a maximum of 31°C during the day, falling to a pleasant 25°C during the evening hours.

Currency

The unit of currency is the Singapore Dollar (S\$). For currency exchange, banks and money changers are located in most shopping centres and at the airport. One US\$ is approximately equivalent to \$\$1.774 (as at June 2002). You are advised to check the rates applicable in your own country. Credit cards are widely accepted.

Food

Food is a national passion among Singaporeans. From street-side hawker stalls to Cordon Bleu, the city is home to a delicious array of Chinese, Indian and Malay cuisines as well as culinary favourites from all over the world. There are restaurants that suit every budget.

Shopping

Instructions for submission of abstracts

- 1. Applicants should fill up the Registration Form and submit it together with 3 duplicate copies of the abstract to the Conference Secretariat. Please tick the appropriate box under the Presentation Section to indicate the mode of presentation, ie. oral or poster. The deadline for submission has been extended to 2 September 2002. Facsimile transmission of an abstract cannot be accepted. If additional abstract form is required, photocopies of the original may be used.
- 2. The Organising Committee is offering Sponsorships to medical technologists who are in need of financial support. To be eligible for consideration, the applicant must meet the following criteria:-
 - Must forward a letter of application to the Conference Secretariat
 - Must be working full-time in a healthcare institution
 - When applying for sponsorship, an abstract must be submitted together to the Conference Secretariat by September 2, 2002.
 - Note: Conference registration for successful applicants will be waived. The decision of the Organising Committee is final.
- 3. Abstract should contain work that has not been previously published.
- 4. Instructions for preparing abstracts:
 - a. Practise typing or printing on a rectangle before using the original abstract form. Keep original abstract form clean and do not fold or staple the abstract.
 - b. Use an electric typewriter with "Elite" or similar type, 12 characters to the inch, or word processor using "Times" or a similar font of 10 point size.
 - c. The abstract should not be more than 250 words (inclusive of title, authors, institution, text). Use single line spacing. It must be typed or printed wholly within the box framed without erasures, smudges and editorial corrections as your original submission will appear in print exactly as you submit.
 - d. Type the title of the paper in capital letters and bold. Make the title brief and indicate the nature of study clearly.
 - e. Full names of all authors in capital and small letters, family name in capital letters, with the name of presenting author underlined. The Department, Hospital//Institution, Country of first author follows. Omit degrees, title, etc.
 - f. Leave double line spacing before starting on text of abstract. Text of abstract should begin with statement of the main purpose of the study, preferably in one sentence. A statement of the methods used should follow.
 - q. A summary of the results should be presented in an easily comprehensible manner to support the conclusions.
 - h. Do not indent titles or paragraphs. Do not subtitle.
 - i. Graphs, tables or references should not be included in the abstract.

Failure to comply with these requirements may exclude the abstract from consideration.
